#### Note from the Senior Warden

Dear friends,

Former Sr. Warden and all-around wonderful person Sue Smith recently sent me a brief history of St. Luke's that she had uncovered while unpacking. I was delighted to learn that we have been on a journey since 1897. Originating as a boy's club outreach project of St. Anne's, we began by erecting a small chapel and school on Second Street. In 1926, we raised a larger building at the same location for worship and social outreach until our current building was consecrated in 1957. In 1983, St. Anne's granted us status as an independent congregation, with the Rev. Jim McNamee transitioning from vicar to our first rector. After his retirement in 2001, I'm personally grateful that the vestry called the Rev. John Smith to serve as rector until his retirement in 2010. We then called the Reverend Diana Carroll who served faithfully until last year. And now we are pleased to welcome the Rev. Lauren Bloom. In addition to our rectors, we are also grateful to the Reverends Jack Wheeler and Norm Crews for the unfailing love, support, and ministries.

For the past eight months, we have been praying as a community for God to strengthen our life together and open us to "new possibilities in our leadership, stewardship, and vision". Even as we prayed these words, God was preparing Lauren+ to answer our call. God's preparation and proddings can be seen throughout our history, even if they were not always apparent at the time.

We owe our origins to St. Anne's, but St. Luke's was clearly called to have its own identity. In 1969, a diocesan consultant commented that "the early 'fishing village' character of St. Luke's has not been completely

dispelled." It's not clear if he meant that as a pro or con, but I take it as a pro... it's a faithful identity that remains true to this day. We are sincere, industrious, spunky, unpretentious, and our love can be seen in our work.

That consultant's fishing village analogy is particularly apt given our Lord's charge to be fishers of people. Interestingly, as I was reading this history of St. Luke's I was also reading Meister Eckart's Fourth Sermon, which speaks beautifully about contemplation, action, love, and – of all things - fishhooks. In speaking of the challenges of the spirit occupying an alien and difficult world, Eckhart concludes his sermon saying, "With love you overcome [strife] most surely... God lies in wait for us with nothing so much as with love. For love resembles the fisherman's hook... he who is caught by it has the strongest of bonds and yet a pleasant burden... Nothing brings you closer to God or makes God so much your own as the sweet bond of love."

We have been praying for new possibilities in our leadership, stewardship, and vision. I wonder where God's prodding will lead us next. What new possibilities does God has in mind for our stewardship and vision? I am confident love will continue to play a central role. Rev. Bloom's first day as Priest-in-Charge will be July 16, which is also when the vestry meets for our annual retreat. This is always a good time to reflect and to receive. Please continue to pray for St. Luke's... for stewardship, vision, and, above all, for love.

I am glad we are on this journey together. Thank you for your presence, love, and support to this wonderful fishing community we call St. Luke's.

Many thanks to everyone for your continuing financial support.

As a reminder, there are several ways by which you may keep your pledge up to date and provide other contributions:

This method deducts a service fee of approximately 3% for each transaction, and so reduces your total gift amount to the church. ## Hybrid Worship Spring Updates

We are continuing to offer our regular 10 am Sunday worship service in a hybrid format. This means that worshipers have the option to participate in person in the sanctuary, on Zoom, by phone, and on Facebook Live.

### **What to expect if you come in person:**

Those attending in person are welcome to wear masks, **but masks are no longer mandatory.**

We are not requiring social distancing, however, we ask that you refrain from making physical contact (i.e. handshakes) with those outside your household, including during the passing of the peace.

Some windows will be opened to provide greater ventilation.

Music is a combination of live singing accompanied by Dr. Ildar Khannanov and recorded music sung by our virtual choir. Under new guidance from the Episcopal Diocese of Maryland, the congregation is permitted to sing with masks on.

We are using an option for Holy Communion recommended by the bishop known as "shallow intinction". The celebrant alone will dip (intinct) the edge of each wafer into the wine before placing it in the hands of the recipient. Intinction by individual worshipers will no longer be permitted in this diocese due to the associated health risks.

Please read the Episcopal Diocese of Maryland's Green Phase [Guidelines for Regathering](#) before attending in person.

### **What to expect if you attend on Zoom, by phone, or through Facebook Live:**

Our goal is to enable those who attend worship remotely to be fully included in the service as much as possible. We are exploring ways to increase interaction between those who are in person and those joining remotely.

The video originates on Zoom and is shared from there to Facebook. Those online are able to hear and see what is happening in the sanctuary, and those in the sanctuary are able to hear those on Zoom when desired (for instance, a Reader or Intercessor may serve remotely).

The worship bulletin is shared on the screen. The text of the worship service is also available to download from our website (and at the links further down in this email) as a seasonal worship booklet and weekly inserts.

A brief social time follows the service for those on Zoom.

### **What about other forms of gathering?**

- St. Luke's Food Pantry continues to operate on Tuesday mornings from 11 am to noon under their revised protocols. **Masks are still required of everyone, regardless of vaccination status.** Donations are received at the church on Monday mornings between 10 and 11 am.
- The Friday Morning Contemplative Prayer Group is meeting solely on Zoom at this time.
- Small groups, such as committees, are encouraged to meet outdoors. If you are meeting in person at the church (even outside) or using the church Zoom account, **please make sure to check the calendar for space/Zoom availability and schedule your meeting with Dalyn Huntley.**

- With permission of the Vestry, Alcoholics Anonymous has resumed meeting indoors in the Undercroft on Monday and Wednesday evenings at their old time of 5:45 to 6:45 pm. Cub Scout Pack 153 meets on Thursday evenings in the Undercroft and in the amphitheater area.

## **Restoration of Nature & the Smithsonian Environmental Research Center**

Back in April, St. Luke's Restoration of Nature was invited by the Citizen Science team at the Smithsonian Environmental Research Center (SERC) to participate in a grant application for the development of citizen science and education programs tailored around restorations on church properties. The Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History, Interfaith Partners for the Chesapeake, and Stillmeadow Fellowship in Baltimore are also partners. We are excited to announce that the grant application was successful. The program will have 2 components: Citizen science; and education.

The citizen science portion will be getting started first and is the one that will most directly involve the Environmental Committee and anyone in the congregation that might be interested. We are looking for people to make measurements at 1-to-3 week intervals in one of four areas: 1-PolliNation DC (a partnership between iNaturalist and the Natural History Museum); 2-Water quality; 3-Invasive species; and 4-Phenology—the science of cyclical phenomena e.g. the timing of emergence, flowering, leaf-fall, etc. **Training in making the measurements—each person will choose 1—will take place in July. If you would like to attend the training, please contact Anne Arms ([armspna@aol.com](mailto:armspna@aol.com)) for a link to a Doodle Poll to establish the best date and time.**

If you are interested but cannot make the training, please express interest anyway, as it will be possible to receive training later from someone who took it.

The Phenology study could be really fun, as it will involve placing one's camera phone in a bracket to give a standardized view and uploading the photo to a website with a QR code where things like plant growth, flowering, invasions, or herbivory can be monitored over

time. It will be something that passersby can contribute to, as well. All measurements will be suitable for families to involve children.

## Light House Shelter Meal Support Ministry

St. Luke's will resume providing lunches to the Lighthouse shelter on **Sunday, July 10**. Lesley Margerrison will coordinate the preparation and Linda Elkington will manage shopping for supplies. Everyone is invited to help make sandwiches after services during fellowship.

We are asking for volunteers to deliver the lunches to the shelter (on Hudson St., off West St.) each Sunday.

## Lunch Bunch


